FORMAT&RULES

- Women's football: one group with four teams. Each team will play everyone once. The top two teams on the table at the end of the round robin qualify for the final.
- Men's football: two groups with three teams. Teams will play each team in the opposite group once. The top two teams on the overall six-team table at the end of the round robin qualify for the final.
- Two points will be awarded for a round-robin win; one point for a draw.
- If teams are level on points at the end of the group, placings will be decided by the following criteria in the following order:
 - a.Score difference
 - b.Scores for (max)
 - c.Scores against (min)
 - d. Head-to head (where applicable)
- Games will be seven players aside, with max squads of 14 players permitted.
- Games will be 10 minutes a half; 15 minutes a half for the finals.



PARTICIPATING CLUBS



BALLARAT CLOVERS

Ballarat Clovers is a new regional Victoria team, which started in 2022. In April 2023, we travelled to Koroit Irish Festival where the men's team competed in the seven-a-side tournament against local and Melbourne teams. We won the inaugural Koroit Festival men's title. In 2023, our men's and women's footballers lined out at the Regional Games in Geelong, and we're delighted to have teams competing at the Regional Games in 2024.



The Geelong Gaelic Club was originally founded in 1952. In 1954, Geelong became the first club to win the Victorian Hurling Championship beating Young Ireland in the final in Geelong. Few games were played from the 1960s to the mid 1980s as the club struggled to find players. In 1987, Brendan Carty reformed the club, however, it wasn't until 2013 that the club found its feet as the Geelong Gaels GAA Club, entering teams in the Pearse's Sevens, and the Victorian Football Championship. The club has entered a team in the League and Championship ever since. In 2017, the Gaels travelled to Hobart and won the inaugural Australasia Regional Games, with that being our first major piece of silverware. 2018 was a huge year for us as it saw us set up our women's and underage sections of the club. We held the Regional Games that year and we defended our men's title, and the women's team won their championships as well. 2023 marked our 10-year anniversary, and we were thrilled to host the Regional Games, and see our women's footballers win the title for the third time.







GOLD COAST GAELS

The Gold Coast Gaels were established in 2013 and after a number of tough years, are now in a strong position. The 2023 season saw the Gaels men reach the Queensland championship semi-finals for the first time since our first season. our numbers have grown year on year, and we now have over 60 players registered, along with over 120 members. The future of the club is looking bright. The Gaels are a major hub in the Irish community on the Gold Coast, with helping new immigrants settle in with work and making new friends. We host various events throughout the year with poker/trivia nights, fundraising with the annual Darkness into Light walk, as well as golf days. The Regional Games have been one of our highlights since its inception back in 2017, and we look forward to meeting up with teams that have been participating each year, and making new friends. We were delighted to win the men's competition at last year's games in Geelong in our 10th anniversary year, and here's hoping we can go back to back in Hobart.



TASMANIA

The Tasmanian Gaelic Football and Hurling Association (TGFHA) was established in 2007 and represents the sport for the state of Tasmania. The association hosts an annual mixed social league through spring and summer in Hobart, Tasmania. Four Gaelic football teams (Shamrocks, Celts, Na Fianna and the Bushrangers) compete for the Kieran Middleton Cup. Approximately 45 registered players make for lively and healthy competition, whilst supporters big and small cheer on from the sidelines. The social, family-friendly nature of the club attracts those with plenty of experience in the GAA pitch, AFL and soccer, as well as those who are new to the game and want to get involved. The club hosts pre-season sessions, which focus on recruitment and welcoming new players, whilst also welcoming back familiar faces and thawing out those legs after a Tasmanian winter. TGFHA sent a team to the Regional Games on the Gold Coast in 2022 and Geelong in 2023. We're delighted to be hosting this year's competition for the first time since 2017, and we would love to top it off with some silverware.





Y O U N G M E L B O U R N E

Founded in 2016, Young Melbourne GAA was formed to provide the children of those with an affinity to Ireland, our diaspora and the wider Australian community an opportunity to learn the skills of hurling/camogie & Gaelic football (Gaelic games) as they engage inclusively with each other in a safe, family-friendly and community environment. Our values are firmly aligned to the values of the modern GAA.

Not long after the kids got involved, the parents wanted to have a go too and Young Melbourne expanded to include men's and ladies teams, catering for all skill levels and commitments.

We have over 200 junior members and over 100 adult members (two men's teams and a new ladies team and hurling team starting this year!) and growing in central Melbourne which is accessible and convenient.
